'O' ANTIPHONS

From December 17 to 23, the Church calls out to the Saviour to come quickly. The 'O' Antiphons to the Magnificat at Vespers (a variation of which are used also as the Gospel acclamation at Mass) speak to the Lord using different scriptural titles, urging Him to come ('veni' in Latin). For those who appreciate a bit of fun with language, you may note that the first letters of each of the titles of Christ, in Latin, spell out 'SARCORE' which in reverse is 'EROCRAS' or ero cras, meaning 'I will be [here] tomorrow [eve of December 24]'. (The similarity between the 'O' Antiphons and the hymn 'Come, O Come, Emmanuel' is no accident.)

December 17

O Sapientia, quae ex ore Altissimi prodidisti, attingens a fine usque ad finem, fortiter suaviterque disponens omnia: veni ad docendum nos viam prudentiae.

Wisdom, O holy Word of God, you govern all creation with your strong tender care. Come and show your people the way to salvation.

December 18

O Adonai et Dux Domus Israel, qui Moysi in igne flammae rubi apparuisti, et ei in Sina legem dedisti: veni ad redimendum nos in bracchio extento.

O sacred Lord of ancient Israel, who showed yourself to Moses in the burning bush, who gave him the holy law on Sinai mountain: come, stretch out your mighty hand and set us free.
