

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

Through the centuries, the Church has become ever more aware that Mary, "full of grace" through God, was redeemed from the moment of her conception. That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses, as Pope Pius IX proclaimed in 1854: The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Saviour of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin.

The "splendor of an entirely unique holiness" by which Mary is "enriched from the first instant of her conception" comes wholly from Christ: she is "redeemed, in a more exalted fashion, by reason of the merits of her Son". The Father blessed Mary more than any other created person "in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places" and chose her "in Christ before the foundation of the world, to be holy and blameless before him in love". (CCC 491-492)

There will be a Solemn High Mass at Holy Family Church on December 8 at 6:00 p.m. Solemnity, not a day of abstinence.

CHRISTMAS

This year Christmas falls on a Monday.

The obligation to attend Holy Mass on all Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation applies to both Christmas and January 1, the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God (these are the only Holy Days of Obligation in Canada). For this year, that means each Catholic must attend a Mass for the Sunday (either Saturday evening or Sunday) AND a Mass for the Holy Day (either Sunday evening or Monday) for each of those two weekends. 

She is the patron of the university of Paris, one of the oldest universities in the world. St Catherine is credited with successfully debating hundreds of pagan philosophers about the truth of God's existence and his plan of salvation in Christ.

Trivia – St Vincent de Paul's Life and Times:

November 27 was the feast of the miraculous medal. Designed by Mary herself, the miraculous medal is the most widely disturbed religious medal in the world. The design was revealed to St Catherine Laboure whose feast day is November 28. St Catherine Laboure was a Daughter of Charity, the order founded by St Vincent de Paul and St Louise de Marillac!

Wisdom from St Vincent de Paul:

"She was most patient and never complained." – St Vincent's description of Sister Marguerite Naseau, the first to serve the sick in the parish of St Saviour.
