ASH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 17

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence. All Catholics fourteen years and over are bound by the law of abstinence (abstaining from meat); and all Catholics who are eighteen to fifty-nine years old are bound by the law of fasting. Fasting means one regular sized meal and two smaller ones that together do not exceed the regular sized one. It also means no eating between meals.

LENT

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. We are asked to imitate Christ who spent forty days in fasting and prayer in the desert. A traditional Lenten program includes elements of fasting and penance, prayer, and almsgiving (or works of mercy). If you are thinking about what to do, these suggestions might help. Do not take on all of them. Choose something that you think that you will be able to do until Easter.

Fasting and Penance

- Give up eating between meals.
- Give up drinking alcoholic beverages.
- Give up desserts, chocolate, salt & pepper, or other food group.
- Get up as soon as the alarm rings.
- Give up TV, movies, computer games.
- Give up recreational use of the internet.
- Take up some form of exercise.
- Go to confession.

Prayer

- Come to Mass on weekdays.
- Come to Stations of the Cross.
- Pray the Rosary.
- Read the Bible, the Catechism, or books about the saints.
- Spend some time in mental prayer.
- Participate in the 40 Days for Life prayer vigil for an end to abortion.

Almsgiving (Works of Charity)

- Give to the parish or Share Life.
- Take time to visit relatives or friends in hospital or nursing homes.
- Write letters to relatives or friends.
- Join a parish organization (and plan to continue after Easter).
