

100TH ANNIVERSARY CORNER

Daily Rosary

As we begin the year of Our Lord 2024, an exciting development in our parish is taking place. The daily public recitation of the rosary is recommencing! We are going to pray at the following times:

Monday-Thursday: 8:40 a.m. Fridays – 7:30 p.m. Saturdays: 10:40 a.m. Sunday: 10:25 a.m. (between the 9:30am and 11:00am Masses).

These times have been worked out by various experiments over the past couple of months. The daily recitation of the rosary before our statue of Mary was a promise made to Our Lady if she would heal a young parishioner diagnosed with lifethreatening cancer. Our Lady seems to have answered the prayers of many in the parish.

Pamphlets on how to pray the rosary will be provided! Rosaries will be provided. But why the rosary? What is the secret to the power of the rosary? Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger once gave this answer:

"The historical origin of the rosary lies in the Middle Ages. This was a time when the Psalms were the normal form of prayer. But the great number of unlettered persons of that period could not take part in the biblical Psalms. Therefore, people looked for some kind of Psalter for them and found the prayers to Mary with the mysteries of the life of Jesus Christ, strung out like beads on a necklace. They touch you in a meditative way, so that the repetition allows the soul to settle into tranquility, and holding fast to the Word, above all to the figure of Mary and to the images of Christ that pass you by, make your soul calm and free and grant it a vision of God" (God and the World: Interviews with Peter Seewald, 318-9).
