STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

The present phase of the stained glass window restoration has been completed by Han Stained Glass at a cost of 55,000 including GST. The company made a donation to the parish of \$5,250, for which we are most grateful. Nevertheless, we had to take out a loan of \$20,000 to pay the contract. By doing this project before July 1, we saved over \$4,000 in

increased taxes, so it made sense to take out a loan. But it needs to be paid back. Please keep that in mind when making your contributions to the parish, especially to the Maintenance and Debt Fund. Many people have noted how bright the restored windows are, especially when compared to the 8 windows on the north and south walls of the nave that have yet to be done. We hope to continue with this work as soon as we can afford it!

SS. PETER AND PAUL, AND THE FIRST MARTYRS OF THE CHURCH IN ROME



The memorial on June 30 is in honor of the nameless followers of Christ brutally killed by the mad Emperor Nero as scapegoats for the fire in Rome. The pagan historian Tacitus and St.

Clement of Rome tell of a night of horror (August 15, 64 A.D.) when in the imperial parks Christians were put into animal skins and hunted, were brutally attacked, and were made into living torches to light the road for Nero's chariot. The feast day of June 29 commemorates the martyrdom of the two great Apostles, assigned by tradition to the same day of June in the year 67 during Nero's persecution of the Christians in Rome. They had been imprisoned in the famous Mamertine Prison of Rome and both had foreseen their approaching death.

Pope Clement I, third successor of St. Peter, writes: "It was through envy and jealousy that the greatest and most upright pillars of the Church were persecuted and struggled unto death.... First of all, Peter, who because of unreasonable jealousy suffered not merely once or twice but many times, and, having thus given his witness, went to the place of glory that he deserved. It was through jealousy and conflict that Paul showed the way to the prize for perseverance. He was put in chains seven times, sent into exile, and stoned; a herald both in the east and the west, he achieved a noble fame by his faith . . . Around these men with their holy lives there are gathered a great throng of the elect, who, though victims of jealousy, gave us the finest example of endurance in the midst of many indignities and tortures . . . But they courageously finished the course of faith and despite their bodily weakness won a noble prize."
