BL. SALVIO HUIX MIRALPEIX, PRAY FOR US



Blessed Salvio was born on December 22, 1877 in Santa Margarida de Vellors in the Diocese of Vic in Catalonia, Spain. He was born into a pious and wealthy family. Salvio was known for his hard work as a student and seminarian and for his problems controlling his temper. He was ordained

a priest in 1903 and four years later he entered the Congregation of the Oratory of Vic. For twenty years he lived the Oratorian life of prayer, preaching and administering the Sacraments. In 1927, he became the Provost of the Vic Oratory, and then was nominated as Bishop of Ibiza. He was imprisoned during the Spanish Civil War in 1936. With his fellow prisoners he shared suffering and the joys of secret prayers and Masses. He died a martyr's death when he was shot by Republican forces on the morning of August 5, 1936. The beatification of Bishop Miralpeix, the first Oratorian martyr, took place in Tarragona, Spain, on October 13, 2013.

Almighty and eternal God, who in your goodness bestowed on the bishop and martyr Salvio Huix the gift of pastoral charity even to the point of shedding of his blood for Christ and his Church, bestow on us also the grace to work faithfully in your vineyard and to experience his intercession in this life. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

ALL SOULS' DAY ENVELOPES

Envelopes for All Souls are at the back of the church. The 10:00 a.m. Saturday Masses throughout the year are offered for the souls of the deceased friends and relatives of parishioners who request them. You may include your offering in next Sunday's collection or in the regular Sunday collections for the next few weeks.

BURIAL OF DECEASED MEMBERS

In ancient Christian traditions, the Church asks that the faithful be buried in Catholic cemeteries or other sacred places. Since 1963, the Church has accepted cremation as an alternative burial. The Church raises no doctrinal objections to this practice, since cremation of our loved ones does not affect his/her soul, nor does it prevent God from raising up the deceased body to new life. Thus, cremation does not deny the Christian doctrine of the soul's immortality nor that of the resurrection of the body. The number of people being cremated has increased over the years. Unfortunately, with this increase come practices that are not appropriate or acceptable. According to the Church teachings, scattering cremated remains on the sea, in the air, on the ground, or keeping them in homes, does not display appropriate reverence. When cremation has been chosen, the ashes of the faithful must be laid to rest in a sacred place, in a cemetery or an area for this purpose, and so dedicated by the bishop. This shows fitting respect for the one who has died. There is also a spiritual and emotional benefit when cremated remains are laid to rest in a proper place of burial.
