WHY DO WE RING THE BELL?

Sometimes people wonder why the server rings a bell at Mass. We ring it four times during the Mass. The first is a signal that the Consecration is at hand. The second and third are during the elevation of the Sacred Host and the Chalice containing the Precious Blood. These are both a signal to the worshippers that our Lord has become present, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, on the altar, and a kind of hymn of praise to Him. The fourth bell, during the priest's Communion, is a signal to those who are receiving Communion to begin coming up to the Communion rail. In case you are confused as to when the right time is to begin coming up, may this be of assistance: the bell is your signal.

Last week's Answer: All of the above. Our Lord wanted to give his Church a memorial of his Sacrifice. His sacrifice on the Cross is the most important event in human history. By love and obedience unto death, Christ has reconciled us to His Father and taken away the sins of the world. But that event was not to be like all other historical events. It would not just happen and pass away. It must remain. We must be able to make contact with his Sacrifice. And we can through the Mass. As he did at the Last Supper, Christ continues to symbolise and make present his death on the Cross by the separation of his Body and Blood on the altar. At every Mass, after the priest lays the Body and Blood on the altar, he offers to the Father the one sacrifice of Christ. We stand with Mary and John on Calvary. We offer Christ to the Father. We also offer ourselves through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ.

Trivia - St Vincent de Paul's Life and Times:

Having been inspired by Father Berulle, St Vincent would go on to inspire other priests to be faithful in their priesthood. Even before he opened his seminaries, St Vincent de Paul started giving retreats to men about to be ordained (ordinands). Between 1628 and 1660, he gave ordination retreats to 13,000 or 14,000 men on the verge of being ordained. He did not think that the advice and help he gave was too late for these men. 'Better late than never'! Let us all pray for the grace to seize moments of grace and not miss opportunities to do some good!
