We are now in Step 3 of the Province's reopening regulations. Because of the 6' distancing rule, we are keeping our capacity limit at 90 persons.

Registration is still necessary for Sunday Masses, but not for the Saturday afternoon Mass or if you wish to attend the Mass of our sister parish, St Thomas More. If you know parishioners who are not tech savvy, please feel free to sign them up, or ask them to call the Oratory (416 532-2879) between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. beginning on Wednesdays so that we can sign them up. Please note that you can deregister yourself in case you are feeling sick or need to change your plans.

There will be Confessions before all Masses, and we will continue to have Confessions on Friday morning from 11 a.m. to 12 noon

We are required under the city of Toronto by-law to wear masks in church, unless you are exempted.

Sanitizing materials are available in the church for you to sanitize the place where you are praying. If a pew is not going to be used again within an hour it does not need to be sanitized. Sanitizing, therefore, will not be needed Monday to Saturday, but will be needed on Sunday.

WHY DO WE RING THE BELL?

Sometimes people wonder why the server rings a bell at Mass. We ring it four times during the Mass. The first is a signal that the Consecration is at hand. The second and third are during the elevation of the Sacred Host and the Chalice containing the Precious Blood. These are both a signal to the worshippers that our Lord has become present, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, on the altar, and a kind of hymn of praise to Him. The fourth bell, during the priest's Communion, is a signal to those who are receiving Communion to begin coming up to the Communion rail. In case you are confused as to when the right time is to begin coming up, may this be of assistance: the bell is your signal.
