ST. JOHN HENRY CARDINAL NEWMAN

John Henry Newman (1801-1890) was an Anglican clergyman and a teacher at Oxford University. In 1845, on October 9, at the age of 44, he became a Roman

Catholic and soon after was ordained a priest. He established the first Oratory of St. Philip Neri in the English-speaking world. A theologian and Church historian, he devoted his life to Catholic education, pastoral work and writing. He was named a cardinal by Leo XIII, in 1879. He died August 11, 1890. On September 19, 2010 he was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI, and Pope Francis canonized him on October 13, 2019. *There will be a sung English Mass on Monday, October 9 at 5:00 p.m. at Holy Family.*

At that Mass, **Br Bruno Hegedus** will receive the ministry of Lector and **Br Jeffrey Sullivan** (having finished his three-year novitiate that day) will become a candidate for ordination. Please pray for these two members of the Toronto Oratory. Please join us for the Mass at Holy Family.

Do you know your church?

In the stained-glass window above the altar, we have an image of Christ on the Cross. Standing by the Cross of Jesus are His Mother and the disciple whom He loved. Why did Fr Minehan, our first pastor, want that image of the Crucifixion to be the central image of the Church? 1) The Mass, by the separate and double consecrations, makes present the very sacrifice of the Cross of Jesus. 2) At the Mass, the Church unites herself to Christ and offers herself with Him to the Father. 3) The Mass is a sacrificial banquet (like the first Passover) in which we first offer the Divine Victim and then receive the Lamb of God. 4) After the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, we stand on Calvary with Mary Magdalene and John and the Blessed Virgin Mary. 5) All of the above.

Last week's Answer: <u>All of the above.</u> Our Lord said that without Him we are nothing. He is the vine; we are the branches. United to Him in the Eucharist we bear much spiritual fruit, above all, charity. We can love God and our neighbour through Christ! But when we take and eat the Eucharist, we are also keeping his commandments. He commanded us: Take and Eat. By keeping those commandments, he gives us his own strength to keep the Ten Commandments!

Trivia – St Vincent de Paul's Life and Times:

St Vincent de Paul spent 51 years of his life in the city of Paris. Paris was his home for the last 51 years of his life. When did the young peasant, the formerly ambitious young priest, the humbled man of God first visit Paris? In 1608. Ordained eight years earlier and recently returned from his slavery in Tunisia, he encountered the city at the age of 27. There he met a priest that changed his life, Father Berulle, the spiritual writer and future Cardinal. Let us thank God, on this Thanksgiving weekend, for the decisive encounters with people that changed our life.
