Trivia – St Vincent de Paul's Life and Times

St Vincent de Paul collaborated with St Louise de Marillac for 36 years. They met in 1624 or 1625. Together they would found the Daughters of Charity in 1633, a revolutionary religious order of sisters. For the first time, a group of sisters was allowed to live outside a monastic enclosure. They would live very close to the people.

Wisdom from St Vincent de Paul

"Their cloister shall be the streets of the city; their cell, a rented room; their chapel, the parish church; their enclosure, obedience; their grill, the fear of God; and their veil, holy modesty." – St Vincent de Paul, August 24, 1659, Rules of the Daughters of Charity
