PRINCIPLES OF THE LITURGY

The first document to arise from the Second Vatican Council was on the Liturgy. The Bishops had a keen sense that the liturgy needed to be renewed so that the people would recognize that mass is not something we watch but rather it is an act of worship in which all are called to participate. In fact, the document called for *full, active and conscious participation.*

The liturgy is not something that just happens each week. There is a lot of preparation that is involved: we need lectors, ushers, altar servers and ministers of holy communion. Our music ministry prayerfully reflects on the readings and chooses songs with the aid of liturgical resources that will best fit the Sunday and the Season. They learn new songs and new mass settings and then teach them to us so that our liturgies are good celebrations. We now have learned three distinct mass settings since 2011. Gone are the days when we used one setting for 30 years (i.e. the old Mass of Creation).

We need to be constantly renewed and having different settings that we can use in different seasons helps us to worship. We have learned new songs from the Celebrate in Song and even CBW #3 instead of just relying on the old standards of Glory and Praise Vol. 1 (2 other volumes were published after this one).

The liturgy is meant to be dynamic and blends the new and old, the contemporary and the traditional. It relies on each one of us prayerfully preparing before we arrive (on time preferably) and actively engaging in this act of worshipping God while we are together and then joyfully going out to witness to the Gospel (at the end of mass, not at the end of communion or before the blessing).
