Many things are required as we keep moving forward to the full implementation of our Family of Parishes in July. -Build a healthy and effective parish team comprised of Fr. Rob, Pastor; Fr. Daniel Bombardier, Associate Pastor; Mrs. Maria Mollica Co-ordinator of Youth Ministry; Mrs. Rachelle Leslie, Pastoral Minister

-meet with current parish and finance council members -establish a transition team

-regular communication to all parishioners to keep them informed of mass schedules, sacramental preparation, common projects

-organize IT and building audits; determine office location etc.

-meeting with present parish staff for on-going formation and addressing new job descriptions, roles

-encourage all in the four communities to PRAY!

Change can be demanding and stressful but is a regular way of life for disciples. We walk in faith and hope.

A transition team has been formed which includes the members of the present pastoral teams as well as representatives from the 4 parish communities of our family: Our Lady of the Atonement, St. John Vianney, St. Vincent de Paul and St. Anthony of Padua (Hungarian).

This team will be meeting on Saturday, February 23rd to begin the process of planning for our Family, including discerning weekend mass schedules, weekday mass schedules, pastoral care to the schools, nursing homes, etc.

While each parish will remain distinct, there will be a name given to the Family Group.

Fr. Daniel and I will be responsible for the entire family, celebrating mass for all of the communities with the assistance of Fr. Barnabas Kiss OFM from Detroit who will minister at the Hungarian mass.
