Imagine yourself in Zacchaeus' shoes. He is embarrassed about his misdeeds and just wants a brief glimpse as Jesus walks by where he is hiding. Instead the Lord stops, looks up, calls him by name and invites Himself over for dinner. Mercy has triumphed. This encounter reminds us that regardless of our sins and failings, the Lord is always ready to come and meet us, calling us by name and inviting us to trust in His mercy and love. This encounter reminds us that God is always ready to do anything and everything to ensure that not one of us is ever lost. This week, ask yourself: how willing am I to risk everything in order to encounter the Lord and His grace?


SUNDAY MISSALS
