Twenty Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time September 12th, 2021 A Message From Fr. Rob....

Today's Gospel contains one of those life changing questions that confront the disciples and each one of us. Jesus simply but directly asks: "who do you say that I am?" Our entire discipleship is spent in trying to figure out an answer to that question. Only by drawing close to the Lord in prayer and spending time with Him do we begin to discover the level of intimacy that Jesus desires to have with each of us. From the moment we are baptized, we are invited to develop and to sustain a personal relation with the Lord who invites us to follow Him.

St. James in our second reading offers practical advice on how to do that. Of course he is convinced we are to have a life of faith. nourished by prayer and the Eucharist but this life of faith is lived out in the concrete, practical ways that we work for others. We know that we are growing in faith if we truly find ourselves each day finding ways of doing things for others in a loving manner.

I have submitted my resignation as Episcopal Vicar to Bishop Fabbro and he has accepted. I am learning rather late in life that you can only do so much in one day and parish tasks as well as obligations to my elderly parents at the moment is more than enough.

We cannot increase capacity because we are required to maintain physical distancing throughout the church. This means we are only allowed in a specific number of people at each mass. Please call in for mass each week (Tuesday-Thursday 9 am to 3 pm.) That way we are prepared for the numbers and have the configuration arranged of those attending to ensure seats for all who have registered. It is like a puzzle each week.

Please do not just arrive and assume you can be accommodated. This adds to the stress and length of the check in procedure for the ushers and is also unfair to the people who called for a seat and were turned away because we had already hit our capacity. We are required to keep the name and contact number of each person/ family group. It will continue to be some time for all these COVID 19 protocols. I know at times it is frustrating but these are the conditions under which we are allowed to operate. We appreciate everyone's patience and understanding. Sometimes we have little glitches as we handle close to 500 calls a week just related to mass reservations.
