

Dear Parishioners,

After the celebration of Christmas and New Year's, we find ourselves in Ordinary Time that leads us to Ash Wednesday and the penitential season of Lent beginning on February 14, 2024. Though it is called *ordinary time*, it is still an important time when the Church calls us to deepen our faith and our commitment to the Gospel.

On January 20<sup>th</sup> we celebrate Father Basil Moreau – the Founder of the Congregation of Holy Cross. The Congregation of Holy Cross was officially founded in 1835 in Le Mans, France. *Holy Cross, Sainte Croix* in French, became the official name, and it was the name of the neighbourhood in Le Mans where Fr. Moreau lived and ministered. Holy Cross Fathers write C.S.C. behind their names, identifying them as belonging to Holy Cross. In French, this means la Congrégation de Sainte-Croix (the Congregation from Holy Cross). In 1841 Fr. Moreau sent groups of priests, brothers, and sisters to the United

States and then later sent groups to Montreal in 1847 and even later to India, Bangladesh, Latin America. and Africa and as such. Congregation of Holy Cross has expanded. Moreau was beatified, by order of Pope Benedict XVI, on September 15, 2007, the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, in Le Mans, France. Work continues today on his cause for canonization. On this special day for the Holy Cross Fathers, I ask you to pray for the works of Holy Cross and pray that the Lord may bless us with vocations to continue this wonderful project initiated by Blessed Basil Moreau. I also invite you to pray for the Canonization of Blessed Basil Moreau.

#### Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

The week of January 18-25 is a special week for Christians around the world as it is celebrated as the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The theme for 2024 is You shall love the Lord your God...and your neighbor as yourself. The theme was selected by the Pontifical Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity, the World Council of Churches, and the Christian Churches in Burkina Faso, coordinated by the community of Chemin Neuf, a French Catholic and ecumenical community of vowed and lay people and its local community in Burkina Faso.

The theme, taken from the first chapter of the Gospel of Luke, reflects the connection between love of God and love of neighbor with a particular concern for challenging the boundaries of who is considered "neighbor". In this pericope, Jesus is questioned as to the path to eternal life. His answer is not to only observe the commandments, but to also imitate the love of God in the giving of self for another. It is a call for charity, mercy, justice, and unity.
