All volunteers are required to comply with our screening program managed by the parish volunteer screening coordinator Pamela Cobham and the screening committee, Christena Abbott, Maria Nichols and Marc Perry.

Ministry positions are assigned a "High" or "General" risk level based on responsibility, government laws and regulations, participant vulnerability, and volunteer exposure to which the volunteer screening process directly responds to.
