This is one way we are being invited to enter into the spirit of Canada's Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action as a faith community.

<u>Gathering Times and Sessions from "Listening To Indigenous Voices"</u>

This series of small group dialogues will begin in February and meet once a month for a total of four gatherings.

- Sunday, February 26th –
 Session 5 Ties of Kinship
- 2. Sunday, March 26th Session 2 - A Tale of Two Communities
- 3. Sunday, April 23rd -Session 7 - Killing the Indian in the Child
- 4. Sunday, May 21st Session 10 - Pathways to Decolonization

Each session is stand-alone so it is not necessary to register for all four sessions.
