Baptism of the Lord

With this Sunday celebrating the baptism of Jesus, the church turns from the Christmas season to "Ordinary Time" — the long stretch of Sundays reflecting on the mission of Jesus until we reach Lent. In each of the Gospels, the public ministry of Jesus begins with this inaugural scene in which Jesus is plunged into the Jordan River by John the Baptist. Jesus' baptism foreshadows our own baptism: fashioned as daughters and sons of God, filled with God's Spirit, commissioned to bring God's love and justice to the world. This feast invites us to think of the very foundation of our faith as Christians — our belief in Jesus as the Son of God; belief in ourselves as Spirit-filled children of God.

Sunday of the Word of God- 23 January 2022

In his Apostolic Letter of 30 September 2019, Aperuitillis Pope Francis established that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be the Sunday of the Word of God. A day dedicated to the Bible will help the church "experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his Word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world," the pope said in the document establishing the special Sunday observance.
