My dear Parishioners,

Today we begin the holiest week of the year. We commemorate the final days of Jesus' life on earth, which leads to His crucifixion, only to be followed by the glorious resurrection of Easter. We begin this week with a sense of celebration - we carry palm branches and echo the hosannas of the people of Jerusalem as Jesus entered their city. Hosannas are replaced with betrayal and denial as Jesus endures suffering and death to save us. Our "elect" will lead us to a new life in Christ as they are baptized, confirmed and share in Eucharist for the first time. The Liturgy of the Triduum is not a simple remembrance but rather a celebration of our own salvation in Christ. EASTER TRIDUUM

Through his paschal mystery, the Lord Jesus redeemed the human race and gave perfect glory to the Father. By dying, Christ destroyed our death; by rising he restored our life. For this reason, the Easter Triduum, when we celebrate the suffering, death and resurrection of our Lord, is the high point of the liturgical year. The Easter solemnity is to the year what Sunday is to the week. The celebration of the Easter Triduum opens with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, reaches its climax in the Easter Vigil, and closes with Evening Prayer II on Easter Sunday.
