In his farewell to his disciples, Jesus' consoling words to them and to us are beautiful: *Do not let your hearts be troubled.*

How does eternal life offer us a peace and strength now? It offers us a vision of the rest of the story - the whole story. When we believe that death - in all its forms - is just a scarecrow, then we grow in courage. At that point, we can begin to feel and look like resurrection people, who know the meaning and the outcome of our life in Jesus. Alleluia!


