Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, which brings our liturgical year, Year C, to a close. We will begin the new Church year, Year A, next Sunday, the First Sunday of Advent. When Pope Pius XI instituted this Feast in 1925, the emphasis was on the social and political implication of Christ's kingship. In an era that was marked by the rise and fall of extreme ideological tendencies, the Church wanted to make a strong statement with this Feast. Its message was simple: Our King is Christ! And his kingship is different from all that we are used to. He does not come with political power or might. He does not come with weapons or threats. No! He comes as one of us. He is a king that became as ordinary as each one of us. The feast is a reminder that the only effective and lasting power in the world is that of unselfish love. But, in a world dominated by war, violence and acts of terrorism, we find it so hard to believe that quiet, gentle and persistent love, which seeks only the good of others, can possibly be more powerful than all the other things we rely for security. Yet, the mandate of Christ our King remains: Love one another, just as I love you. On this special feast let us especially pray for peace and harmony in the Middle East and Ukraine and other parts of the world that are experiencing war and violence at the present time.
