

To light a candle is an act of hope

In the days of apartheid in South Africa, Christians there used to light candles and place them in windows as a sign to themselves and to others that they believed that some day this injustice would end. A candle burning in a window was a sign of hope and a political statement. At one point, the authorities began to crack down on this. It became illegal to have a lit candle in your window, as illegal as carrying a firearm. Eventually, as we know, apartheid was overcome. Lit candles, more than firearms, overthrew apartheid. Hope, not guns, is what ultimately transforms things.

What is Hope?

First of all, it's not wishful thinking. Second, hope is not just natural optimism, an upbeat temperament that always sees the bright side of things. Nor hope bases itself upon empirical facts, but upon belief in a deeper set of realities: God's existence, God's power, God's goodness, and the promise that flows from that....

We light advent candles with just that in mind...we continue to light candles and hope anyway, because **the deepest reality of all is that God exists...**We light candles of hope because God, who is more real than anything else, has promised to establish a kingdom of love and peace on this earth and is gracious, forgiving, and powerful enough to do it.
