INVITATION TO A CLIMATE CONVERSATION

All parishioners are invited to gather on Sunday, September 29, after the 10 am Mass in the Brother Andre Room (south west corner of hall) to chat together about our feelings around the Climate Emergency and ways we can contribute to making a difference. Refreshments will be available. Parents with children are welcome.

The Children's Liturgy of the Word Program at the 10 am Mass starts today, for the 2019-2020 school year.

A reminder to parents about the format and purpose of the program:

The program provides the children **aged 3-11** with an experience of God's Word in the form of Bible stories for the younger group, and the Sunday gospel for the older group.

The younger group is for children **aged 3-6**. Parents can bring these children downstairs to their room before the Mass begins, or they can wait until the children are called to the front by Fr. Jinto. The program for the younger group continues until the end of Communion. After Communion, the children come back upstairs, either to the front of the church, or back to their parents.

The older group is for children **aged 7 to 11** (Grade 2 or higher). This group is sent to their program when Fr. Jinto calls the children to the front. The older children hear the Sunday Gospel and have activities and discussion to reflect on its meaning. They return upstairs just before the Eucharistic Prayer.

NEW VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED: We welcome any of the high-school aged youth of the parish to consider volunteering as a student helper with the younger group (this can be used to count towards your high school community service requirement).

We also welcome parents or other adults to volunteer to become teachers or helpers.

In addition, we are encouraging parents of the children participating in the younger group to come downstairs and volunteer as a helper from time to time. Conducting an activity-based session with 15-20 young children, many Of pre-school age, requires many helpers in order to run smoothly.

SEASON OF CREATION

This week, we will bring attention to the tremendous leadership of youth in our world around eco-conversion and putting Laudato Si' into action. We can be energized and emboldened by the Manifesto of Youth at World Youth Day 2019 for the care of the common home. (Copies of this impressive MANIFESTO are available at the back of the Church).

They say to the world, "Convinced that 'all of us can cooperate as instruments of God for the care of creation' (Laudato Si' 14), we call on everyone, ourselves first, to urgently act to protect our planet and the poorest and most vulnerable people." They say further, "We recognize that the ecological crisis is a symptom of a deeper crisis in the human heart.......It is imperative for us Christians to rediscover the role of creation care in our faith." They refer to **Laudato Si':** "Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience." (LS 217)

They have a list of demands, 1) "We call on bishops and Church leaders to accelerate the implementation of **Laudato Si**" followed by four specific demands relating to a) the development of educational and formation programs leading to a systematic commitment; b)conversion of lifestyles and attention to Church structures; c) ethical investment guidelines; d)empowering of youth in caring for Creation. 2) "We also call on political leaders and competent institutions to take seriously and urgently the main scientists' warnings" followed by five very specific demands relating to a) renewable energy, b) environmental refugees, c) the planet's ecosystems, d) a universal and fair access to drinking water, and e) adoption of a "circular economy" Will we, as a parish, be moved by the courageous voice and action of youth, join them, and support them for the sake of their future and ours? What do the youth of our parish wish to say to us?


