

The UN tells us that **70.8 million people** around the world are forced from their homes. Among them are **25.9 million refugees**, over half of them under the age of **18. 37,000** people <u>a day</u> are forced to flee from home due to conflicts and persecution. We now know that a growing number of these displaced persons are Climate Refugees. We need to take the time to let this sink in, to picture the people who are living this and to pray for them. In this Season of Creation, we can be urged to work all the more to address Climate Change which usually affects the most vulnerable, and their homes.

For many years, Canada has welcomed many refugees, but, in justice, we should be welcoming many more. Sadly, there remain anxiety and even hostility in some persons around the presence of refugees.

In his message for this day, Pope Francis says, "Migrants, especially those who are most vulnerable, help us to read 'the signs of the times'. Through them, the Lord is calling us to conversion, to be set free from exclusivity, indifference and the throw-away culture. Through them, the Lord invites us to embrace fully our Christian life." SEASON OF CREATION

As we come to the last weekend in the Season of Creation, we need to look very seriously at our commitment to Creation and the present Climate Crisis. We **all** contribute to Climate Change in some way, and all of our Church structures also contribute. What are we, as a parish community, prepared to do to make a difference?

Life in the parish - Some suggestions: check the building's energy efficiency; be aware of water consumption; no use of bottled water; be attentive to re-cycling and composting; stay away from plastics, especially single-use; be mindful of use of paper.

A Committee could be formed to look carefully at this, in order to reach a plan for possible changes.

As individual parishioners: excellent guides to lifestyle changes are available at the back of the Church. Have family discussions and make it a family affair. As citizens: Pope Francis has been showing us that to be active as Catholics, we are called to involve ourselves in social/environmental/political matters which impact on the well-being of Creation, human and non-human. He continues to speak out on Care for Creation, our Common Home. In recent months, he has invited all the Finance Ministers of the world, and then all the Oil Company executives, to the Vatican. In these meetings, he stated clearly his perspective on how money should be invested, and how we must respect natural resources. He emphasizes that there is a need for a just transition to a low-carbon society, attending to the most poor, and to future generations. SOCIETY OF SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL HOLY NAME CONFERENCE MID YEAR REPORT 2019

Society of Saint Vincent de Paul - Holy Name Conference **mid-year** report **2019**.

As this week we celebrated the feast day of Saint Vincent de Paul on September 27, the members of the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul–Holy Name Conference would like to provide you with our mid year report and to thank all of you for your support.

In 2018, through the generosity of the Holy Name parishioners and visitors, we collected nearly \$16,475 in donations, \$9,336 of which were tax receipted donations (through regular and Christmas envelopes), \$4,078 from registered charities and \$3,054 in unreceipted donations collected mainly through poor box collections after mass on Saturdays and Sundays. 2018 saw an increase in our receipted donations while our unreceipted donations went down by about \$2,200 however, our registered charity donations were \$4,078. We put these funds to work by supporting our neighbours in need. We do issue tax receipts for donations of \$20 and more. Also, contributions can be made to Saint Vincent de Paul through our annual Share Life Charity.

In 2018 we visited more than 52 different homes and visited with, on average, 18 individuals or families per month bringing them food, vouchers from Pape Foodland for fresh food, and vouchers for clothing and furniture. At Christmas this past year we created over 103 Christmas hampers, including hampers with gifts for 82 children.

As at the end of August, 2019, we have collected over \$5,000 in donations and have distributed over \$4,900 in food and furniture vouchers as well as Metro Food gifts cards to our neighbours in need.

We couldn't do this good work without the support of Holy Name Church, and you, its parishioners. The members of the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul – Holy Name Conference wish to thank you all for your ongoing generosity and support. 
