MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

AUGUST 30: FEAST OF BLESSED JUVENAL ANCINA OF THE ORATORY

In his twenties he occupied the chair of medicine at Turin, treated the poor free of charge, and had chess and the writing of poetry as hobbies. Though he was regularly in the presence of the dying and a frequent attendant at funerals, the young doctor, listening one day to the chanting of the Dies Irae, was overwhelmed by the realization that after death comes judgment.

He seriously thought of becoming a Carthusian, but Saint Philip Neri persuaded him to enter his Oratory instead. Ordained at thirty-six, he wrought marvels in Naples and Rome. One of his practical measures was a deposit with a barber to whom he would send anyone with unkempt hair or beard. He ran off for five months while three bishoprics stood empty, but several years later the Pope ordered him to accept the see of Saluzzo. Before long he was poisoned by a friar whom he had rebuked for scandalous living. He died in 1604.

In his deliberations he would never be hurried; "*Noli urgere*," he would say to those who pressed him to come quickly to a decision; for he had made his own that maxim of his holy Father St. Philip, that wise resolutions require three things - prayer, counsel, and time. And he would add: "*Funiculus triplex difficile rumpitur*." (A threefold cord is not easily broken). When he had to decide any grave matter he never trusted his own judgment, but called together all the officials of his court, and asked their opinions, before he decided on what, before God, seemed to him the most expedient.
