MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

WORLD YOUTH DAY UPDATE

(Here is a note sent by Fr Martin after the Mass celebrated by the Holy Father last Sunday on Copacabana Beach in Rio de Janeiro:)

Last night we slept on Copacabana Beach after the vigil. Well, some of us slept. Others were mesmerized by the surf and the bright lights making sure that there was no security problem. Mass was on time at 10:00 a.m. After Mass, we went swimming in the surf. Now we are back in our host families. But we have to rush to the parish Church for the lay people to receive Communion. Giving Communion to about 3,000,000 people on the beach, among whom were Brazilians in Speedos going to play in the surf, was out of the question.

Everyone is in good spirits although most are understandably tired.

(And here is another note from July 30th showing how our pilgrims are winding down as tourists:)

Today was a great day. There was not a cloud in the sky and the temperature was around 21. We tried to get to Corcovado, but there was such a crowd that we could not get tickets. So we went to the top of Sugar Loaf instead by cable car. It was really a spectacular view. In fact, I think that the view was better than we could have had from Corcovado. We were above the vultures and eagles; and also above jets as they flew into the downtown airport.

The tour guide spoke English very well and knew quite a bit about Brazilian history. We finished with Mass at the shrine of Saint Therese of Lisieux. Most of us went to an all you can eat pizza rodizio. For a set fee, the waiters just keep bringing pizza around -- all sorts of flavours, including dessert pizzas.

Tomorrow we are planning to have Mass early in the morning in a new part of town that looks like Miami Beach -- Barra da Tijuca. It is the church that I stayed in last year. Afterwards, we are going to have a really nice BBQ in a beach club. Then we will have to get up early on Thursday to go to Sao Paulo and back to Canada.
