If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

Note that Sunday, December 30 is the Solemnity of the

Holy Family. Because this is the Patronal Feast of the Parish, a plenary indulgence may be gained by all the faithful who visit the church today and pray there the Creed and the 'Our Father', and, in addition, (1) receive Holy Communion and go to Confession within twenty days (before or after), (2) say a prayer for the Pope's intention, and (3) are completely detached from sin, even venial sin. The indulgence will become partial to the extent that the person attempting to gain it is not detached from sin. An indulgence is a remission of the temporal punishment due to sins, which have already been forgiven through the Sacrament of Penance (Confession). [See the Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1471-79.]
