MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

ORATORY SUMMER SCHOOL

Since 1989, the Oratory has offered a summer school for lay people. There are two week-long sessions. The first week is an introduction to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

The topic for the second week varies each year. The first session is a prerequisite for enrolment in the second session.

There are three classes each day, taught by one of the Fathers of the Oratory. A special Mass is celebrated. And lunch is served. The day begins at 8:30 a.m. and ends at 3:00 p.m. The Oratory can accommodate a limited number of people in the seminary residence. The fee for the course is \$150 per session which includes lunch. The surcharge for rooms in the seminary residence is \$50 per week. Please note that the courses are aimed at adults and older teens.

The topic for the Second Session in the summer of 2012 will be: ***From 'Enlightenment' to Revolution: The Church in the 18th Century.***

AIR CONDITIONING UPDATE

In September of last year, someone trying to make a quick dollar took a hack saw and cut out some of the copper pipes from the a/c units at the back of the church near the school parking lot. We had the police and insurance company involved right away. By January we had a contract in place for \$32,000 and work was supposed to start in March. In March, however, the contractor found that someone had tried to steal a few more pieces of copper, probably shortly after the first theft. Although the value of copper taken was minimal, this attempt allowed water to seep into the system, making it highly likely that the compressor would quickly burn out if we simply replaced the obviously damaged items. So the original contractor backed out. With the help of the insurance company, we contacted the original manufacturer and they agreed to take on the job. The delay comes from the fact that the units were specially designed for our building and were not stock items. There are two units. The larger one is now ready and sitting in a warehouse in the GTA. The smaller one should be ready shortly after this long weekend. Originally, we were hoping that the larger one could be installed first and so we could have at least part of the system working, but the installers explained that if they were to put in the larger one first, the access to the smaller unit's location would be made more difficult and we would risk damage to both units. The total cost of the project is now \$54,000. The insurance company will pay \$53,000 and we are responsible for the \$1,000 deductible. In order to deter someone from trying this again we have put in a security camera and a sign saying that there is a security camera in place. The camera provides several days of records so, should something happen, we will have the video on hand to show the police. But let us pray that no one tries this again.

PILGRIMAGE TO MARTYRS' SHRINE - August 6 - 11

This is a walking pilgrimage for youth, open to boys and girls going to grade 9 and older. It will be supervised by Fr. Martin Hilbert and several adult helpers. **Meet at Holy Family for Mass on Monday, August 6 at 8:30 a.m.** Breakfast will be provided in the parish hall after Mass. We will then drive to Colgan, Ontario, where we will begin to walk, till we arrive at Midland on Friday, August 10. We stay overnight at Martyrs' Shrine and ride back to Toronto the afternoon of August 11. The total walking distance is 110 km, mostly along cycling and snowmobile trails and roads free of traffic. Sleeping accommodations will be in parish halls and tents on parish grounds - modesty and privacy being preserved between facilities for boy and girls.

What to Bring: Sleeping bag/blanket & pad; clothing (especially socks!); personal toiletries; water bottle; rosary; backpack; **good walking shoes; sun hat!**

What NOT to Bring: Electronic gadgets (cell/smart phones, games, MP3 players, etc.). The only exception is cameras.

Pilgrims will need to carry their belongings, at least part of the way, **so pack lightly.** Soap, shampoo, toothpaste, sunscreen, mosquito spray will be provided.

Cost: \$60/pilgrim (if cheques, payable to Fr. Martin Hilbert) **Parents** can get in touch with pilgrims through the Oratory (416-532-2879). The receptionist will provide a cell number for contact.
