MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

Oratory Theology Summer School

Each year there are two week-long sessions, with three classes each day, taught by one of the Fathers or Brothers of the Oratory. **The fee for each session is \$150.** Please note that the courses are aimed at adults and older teens.

Dates for Session 1: July 5-9, 2021 – The first week is an introduction to the Catechism of the Catholic Church. This session is a prerequisite for enrolment in the second session, taken either in the current year or in previous years.

Dates for Session 2: July 12-16, 2021 – The topic for the Second Session will be: **The Protestant Reformation and the Catholic Response.** We will look at this complicated affair from a variety of angles (historical, political, theological, and even artistic), drawing on official Church documents from the Fifth Lateran Council and the Council of Trent as well as the lives of the saints from the period. We will address such enduring topics as the constant need for reform within the Church, the place of Scripture in the Church, the importance of our sacramental life, and the call to a deeper spiritual life, a life dedicated to the pursuit of holiness. These events triggered an outpouring of activity within the Church, a movement called the Counter-Reformation that has helped form the Church for the past five centuries. With a period so complex and interesting, the trouble is not figuring out what to talk about, but deciding what to leave out!

**Humanitarian Relief
India's COVID-19 Outbreak**

India is reeling from a devastating COVID-19 outbreak. In recent days, the country has been reporting more than 400,000 of new cases & 4,000 deaths every 24 hours. International observers expect that the actual numbers are significantly higher. The medical system, funeral services and other social supports are unable to meet the country's needs at this time.

The Archdiocese of Toronto will send donations through Development & Peace to *Caritas International* an international confederation of Catholic humanitarian organizations that is already in India helping those who are suffering during this COVID-19 outbreak.

Since the pandemic began, India's Catholic Church, acting principally through Caritas India, has been supporting some of the most disadvantaged groups, such as those with inadequate housing, migrant labourers, persons with special needs and widows. Relief services and materials provided by the Church, or with its support, include:

- Food at kitchens and distribution centres in slums, at migration transit points, etc.
- Masks, sanitizers and hygiene kits to vulnerable communities
- Psychosocial support and hotline services to traumatized and grieving people
- Public education campaigns on infection prevention and vaccination
- Supporting the public healthcare system, including donating expertise, facilities and equipment from Church-run clinics & hospitals
