If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

Many thanks to the Women's Auxiliary

I want to thank the Women's Auxiliary for their many contributions to the parish and to draw your attention to the work of these faithful women in our community.

They are in the parish hall every Sunday morning, serving coffee and delicious (often home-made) food to those who come down after Mass. They take charge of bigger events such as the Lasagna and Christmas Dinners, and the Christmas Bake Sale. And they are always ready to serve other significant parish and Oratory functions, such as receptions after first Communion and Confirmation, the Family Days of Recollection, Graduation, etc.

They are also generous in using their earnings from the Coffee House and the parish dinners to pay for much needed projects. In February 2022, they paid \$10,000 towards the new LED ceiling lights, which are a great improvement over the previous incandescent bulbs. More recently, they have paid close to \$5,000 for the work on the church doors.

I am sure that everyone going into the church has noticed the improvement.

A big thank you to the Zabs

The work has been done by Andy and Effie Zab, two long-time parishioners with much experience in wood finishing. They had to sand the doors and use various chemical methods to remove prior finishing products before applying seven coats of the new product. They have now stopped for the year, but will resume with the Close Avenue doors and all the door frames in late spring or early summer. They told me that the sun burns through about two layers of the product every year, so if we keep reapplying about four coats every two years, future maintenance of the doors will not be as costly.


