It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

BL. SALVIO HUIX MIRALPEIX, PRAY FOR US

Blessed Salvio was born on December 22, 1877 in Santa Margarida de Vellors in the Diocese of Vic in Catalonia, Spain. He was born into a pious and wealthy family. Salvio was known for his hard work as a student and seminarian and for his problems controlling his temper. He was ordained a priest in 1903 and four years later he entered the Congregation of the Oratory of Vic. For twenty years he lived the Oratorian life of prayer, preaching and administering the Sacraments. In 1927, he became the Provost of the Vic Oratory, and then was nominated as Bishop of Ibiza. He was imprisoned during the Spanish Civil War in 1936. With his fellow prisoners he shared suffering and the joys of secret prayers and Masses. He died a martyr's death when he was shot by Republican forces on the morning of August 5, 1936. The beatification of Bishop Miralpeix, the first Oratorian martyr, took place in Tarragona, Spain, on Oct. 13, 2013.


