MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

Visit of a Cemetery

An indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. The indulgence is **plenary each day from the 1st to the 8th of November**; on other days of the year it is partial.

[From the *Echiridion of Indulgences*]

Q. What is an indulgence?

A. "An indulgence is the remission before God of the temporal punishment due for sins already forgiven as far as their guilt is concerned. This remission the faithful, with the proper dispositions and under certain determined conditions, acquire through the intervention of the Church which, as minister of the Redemption, authoritatively dispenses and applies the treasury of the satisfaction won by Christ and the Saints."



BLESSED SALVIO HUIX MIRALPEIX, PRAY FOR US

Blessed Salvio was born on December 22, 1877 in Santa Margarida de Vellors in the Diocese of Vic in Catalonia, Spain. He was born into a pious and wealthy family. Salvio was known for his hard work as a student and seminarian and for his problems controlling his temper. He was ordained a priest in 1903 and four years later he entered the Congregation of the Oratory of Vic. For twenty years he lived the Oratorian life of prayer, preaching and administering the Sacraments. In 1927, he became the Provost of the Vic Oratory, and then was nominated as Bishop of Ibiza. He was imprisoned during the Spanish Civil War in 1936. With his fellow prisoners he shared suffering and the joys of secret prayers and Masses. He died a martyr's death when he was shot by Republican forces on the morning of August 5, 1936. The beatification of Bishop Miralpeix, the first Oratorian martyr, took place in Tarragona, Spain, on October 13, 2013. *Almighty and eternal God, who in your goodness bestowed on the bishop and martyr Salvio Huix the gift of pastoral charity even to the point of shedding of his blood for Christ and his Church, bestow on us also the grace to work faithfully in your vineyard and to experience his intercession in this life. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.*
