MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

You have no doubt noticed lots of roofing work going on. The parish is responsible for paying for the roof on the rectory and also -- less visibly -- the flat roof over the sacristy. Last year, the parish raffle helped us to accumulate funds to pay for the rectory roof, which is going to be around \$15,000. This year, we discovered that the flat roof over the sacristy needed to be redone as well. The cost of that roof is another \$15,000. We got several contractors to bid on the various roofing jobs and we are confident that we are getting good value for the money. But it still is a large expense. So the parish finance committee decided that it would be prudent to take up a special collection today to finance this essential project. **Please be generous.**

† R.I.P ROBERT ROY GIFFIN †

If you are wondering about the small sprig of wheat with the French Tricolor at our Lady's statue, it is in memory of a former parishioner who was the pilot of a Lancaster bomber shot down over France on July 26, 1944. All the other crew members parachuted to safety. Robert's grave lies in a field of wheat, and a resident of the area who worked in the field became intrigued with his story. Last week he visited the church with the family of the last surviving crew member and asked that this token of remembrance, wheat growing near Giffin's grave, be placed there.

Robert Giffin lived on Tyndall Avenue, and was 23 when he died. The military records show that he spoke English, French superficially, and Latin (!) superficially. Perhaps he served as an altar boy here at Holy Family. Please keep him in your prayers.
