It's hard to believe that Lent is almost over. Lent will end at the beginning of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Thursday evening. Today is

Palm and Passion Sunday, the gateway into Holy Week. This Sunday we will proclaim *The Passion* from Matthew's Gospel.
