Last week we had wonderful Easter celebrations! Our church was filled to capacity at the Sunday morning Masses. A joyful spirit filled the church. Our little children's choir brought such joy on Easter morning! And our adult choir were simply spectacular!

This is the 2nd Sunday of Easter, *Divine Mercy Sunday* (see below). We hear a glorious reading from *Acts of the Apostles*. Today is Divine Mercy Sunday

In 1905, a young Polish girl (Faustina Kowalska) was born into a poor but devout family. As a teenager, she entered the *Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy* in Warsaw. Because she was uneducated, Faustina was assigned the most menial tasks. Yet while cooking, baking, gardening, and housekeeping, Faustina underwent many mystical

experiences during which Our Lord asked her to become both His apostle and His secretary, to announce anew to all people the Gospel of God's mercy. She died in 1938. In one of Christ's messages to her, He said: Humankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to My mercy. Faustina was told that the Church should celebrate a feast in honour of the divine mercy on the Sunday after Easter. Not by accident does the Church, on that day, read the Gospel text that recounts Christ's institution of the Sacrament of Penance, which is the surest and clearest sign of the divine mercy. Faustian wrote down two prayers dictated to her by the Font of Mercy Himself. The first: Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for my sins and those of the whole world. The second: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on me and on the whole world. On April 30, 2000 (Divine Mercy Sunday) Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina and designated the Sunday after Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday (*Dominica II Paschae seu de divina misericordia*). Pope John Paul II died during the vigil of the Divine Mercy Sunday 2005.

Annunciation of the Lord

March 25th was the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord (9 months before Christmas Day). Because it fell on Monday of Holy Week, it is being celebrated on Monday, April 8th. We celebrate the angel Gabriel's appearance to the Virgin Mary (<u>Luke 1:26-38</u>), his announcement that the Blessed Virgin had been chosen to be the Mother of Our Lord, and Mary's *flat*—her willing acceptance of God's holy plan.

Let us pray, that we may become more like Christ, who chose to become one of us...

Almighty Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
You have revealed the beauty of your power
by exalting the lowly virgin of Nazareth
and making her the mother of our Saviour.
May the prayers of this woman
bring Jesus to the waiting world
and fill the void of incompletion
with the presence of her child,
who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit
one God forever and ever. Amen
