19th Sunday August 13, 2023

Our Gospel this Sunday is Jesus Walking on Water and the Calming of the Storm. After he fed the crowds, he sent his disciples in a boat to the other side, and he went off to pray. A storm came up and they were terrified! Jesus appeared to them, *walking on the water*... as they were tossed about. When they saw him, they were frightened. Jesus said: Take courage, it is I, do not be afraid! Then Peter said: Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water! And Jesus said, Come on! Peter walked on the water like a child taking his first steps. But as soon as he took his eyes off Jesus, and looked down at the rough waters, he was overcome with fear and began to sink! Jesus reached out his hand and caught him! You of little faith! And they walked on water, back to the boat together. The storm calmed! And they said, "Truly, you are the Son of God!" We're all in a boat on the sea called life. There are times we struggle with storms and fears. These are the times we really need Jesus' words and his outstretched hand! We need Jesus' words, take courage it is I do not be afraid. God never promised us joy without sorrow; brightness without darkness, nor did he promise us tides which never turn against our bows. But he did promise I will be with you through it all. God gives us whatever we need to continue on the sea of life. Whatever the fear... the struggle, the pain... is there room in our boat for Jesus? Can we take that leap of faith and give Jesus the oars of our lives? Always remember what Isaiah says: I will call on the Lord in my distress and he will answer me.

20th Sunday August 20, 2023

Today's Gospel contains a strong challenge! Jesus is among Gentiles in Tyre and Sidon. A Canaanite woman approaches and shouts for help. The disciples tell Jesus to *send her away*! Her daughter is tormented by a demon, and she knows that Jesus can heal her. She is desperate, and goes as far as calling Jesus, Son of David! She knew who he was! To a Hebrew, a *Canaanite*, was like calling someone a *pagan*! The Hebrews often called pagans, *dogs*, whereas they, the chosen people, called themselves, children of God. Jesus used this occasion to open his disciples' hearts and eves! He gave them an example of what would become their work in the future - to spread the Good News to all who have faith, no matter their nationality! That means being open and accepting towards the outsider... towards everyone. Jesus saw the faith of this woman and he *healed* her daughter from a demon! What can we learn from that? Jesus overcame the barriers that the disciples and the people had created: ethnic, cultural, political, gender, and religious barriers! Everyone matters to God! And so it should be for us!



Consequently, Jesus was banned from further triathlons

Whether Jesus calms the storm or calms us in the storm, His love is the same, and His grace is enough.

Project Share

Project Share is struggling with getting enough food donations. The demand is up and their donations are down. And we all know what the price of food is like! Thankfully, St. Patrick Parish has always been very generous with food donations since we placed the bins in the church in 2003. Project Share has expressed their gratitude to us numerous times. Pasta, soups, tomato sauce, canned tuna, peanut butter, cereals, canned meats, ketchup, canned fruit, juices. "Lord, when did we see you hungry?"
