21st Sunday (August 27th): Who do you say that I am?

This is the question Jesus puts forth to his disciples. Jesus was widely recognized in Israel as a mighty man of God. He was even compared to the great prophets, John the Baptist, Elijah, and Jeremiah. Peter was quick to answer, and exclaimed that YOU ARE the Christ, the Son of the living God. No mortal being could have revealed this to Peter, but only God! Jesus then conferred on Peter, authority to govern the Church that Jesus would build, a Church that no powers would overcome. Ironically here, Jesus played on Peter's name, which is the same word for "rock." To call someone a "rock" is a great compliment. The ancient rabbis had a saying that when God saw Abraham, he exclaimed: "I have discovered a rock to found the world upon". Through Abraham God established a nation for himself. Through faith, Peter grasped who Jesus truly is. He was the first apostle to recognize Jesus as the Anointed One... the Messiah and the Christ. Jesus asks each one of us the same question: Who do you say that I am? We answer that by the way we live. If I profess that Jesus is Lord... then am I ready to follow him ... and do the things he did? ... speak up for the vulnerable, reach out to the same people whom he cared for: the outcast, the broken, the lost, the hungry? Following him is not always easy... but may we never forget that the benefits are out of this world! And it's promised to us all. May we find the strength and courage to do great things in His name... or at best, as Mother Teresa said, do small things with great love!

22nd Sunday (September 3rd): Get Behind Me Satan What a drastic shift in tone! Shortly after Jesus said "You are Peter and upon this Rock I will build my Church," things turn guickly on Peter! Jesus calls him Satan, and a stumbling block! And he pushes him off. Why? After Jesus tells them of his impending death, Peter wants to save Jesus from pain. You can't blame him for that! But there's more involved than just Peter's desire to protect the Messiah whom he loves. Peter should have known better! After all, he's following the prophet Jesus. Peter should remember how many prophets got rejected and killed in his religious tradition! Right now, even Peter himself, is being called to accept a prophetic role and it will cost. "If anyone wants to become my followers, let them deny themselves, take up their cross and follow me!" And following Jesus is not always easy! Christianity is not an easy walk, all smiles and good feelings! There's a cross Jesus invites Peter and all of us to willingly take up each day. We are most likely not going to suffer crucifixion as Jesus did, but it's clear he invites us to make sacrifices for his sake and for the sake of the gospel. May Jesus see in each of us what he saw in Peter, a willingness to do the best we can to follow him, even unto death. Let us join Peter, and try our best on our journey of following Jesus to Jerusalem. And may we never be a "stumbling block" for the Gospel!!!



LABOUR DAY

Labour Day started April 15, 1872, when the Toronto Trades Assembly organized Canada's first significant demonstration for worker's rights. The aim was to release 24 leaders of the Toronto Typographical Union who were imprisoned for striking to campaign for a nine-hour working day. Trade unions were illegal and striking was seen as a criminal conspiracy to disrupt trade. In spite of this, the Toronto Trades Assembly was already a significant organization and encouraged workers to form trade unions, mediated in disputes between employers and employees and signaled the mistreatment of workers. There was enormous public support for the parade and the authorities could no longer deny the important role that the trade unions had to play in Canadian society. A few months later, a similar parade was organized in Ottawa and passed the house of Canada's first prime minister. Sir John Macdonald. He appeared before the gathering and promised to repeal all Canadian laws against trade unions. This happened in the same year and eventually led to the founding of the Canadian Labour Congress in 1883. Canadian trade unions are proud that this holiday was inspired by their efforts to improve workers' rights
