

#### Amatrice Earthquake

We keep the people of Amatrice in central Italy in prayer following the earthquake on August 24th. Pope Francis turned his weekly general audience into a prayer service. As emergency workers began digging people out from under the rubble of collapsed buildings and the number of verified deaths climbing, Pope Francis arrived in St Peter's Square for his general audience. "Hearing the news of the earthquake that has devastated entire areas, leaving many dead and wounded, I cannot fail to express my heartfelt sorrow and my closeness" to everyone in the earthquake zone, especially those who lost loved ones and "those who are still shaken by fear and terror," the Pope said. "Having heard the mayor of Amatrice say, 'The town no longer exists,' and knowing that there are children among the dead, I am deeply saddened," Pope Francis said. The Pope thanked all the volunteers and emergency workers who were trying to rescue victims people trapped under the rubble. Assuring the people in the region of the prayers and "the embrace of the whole Church," the Pope asked the estimated 11,000 pilgrims and tourists in St Peter's Square to join him in praying that "the Lord Jesus, who is always moved by human suffering, would console the broken hearted and give them peace."

## LABOUR DAY

Labour Day started April 15, 1872, when the Toronto Trades Assembly organized Canada's first significant demonstration for worker's rights. The aim was to release 24 leaders of the Toronto Typographical Union who were imprisoned for striking to campaign for a nine-hour working day. Trade unions were illegal and striking was seen as a criminal conspiracy to disrupt trade. In spite of this, the Toronto Trades Assembly was already a significant organization and encouraged workers to form trade unions, mediated in disputes between employers and employees and signaled the mistreatment of workers. There was enormous public support for the parade and the authorities could no longer deny the important role that the trade unions had to play in Canadian society. A few months later, a similar parade was organized in Ottawa and passed the house of Canada's first prime minister, Sir John Macdonald. He appeared before the gathering and promised to repeal all Canadian laws against trade unions. This happened in the same year and eventually led to the founding of the Canadian Labour Congress in 1883. Canadian trade unions are proud that this holiday was inspired by their efforts to improve workers' rights
