

Dear Friends:



Happy New Church Year! Welcome to the Season of Advent! The 1st candle is lit on our Wreath! Jesus says in today's Gospel, **But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Beware, keep alert; for you do**

not know when the time will come. This is a season of waiting, watching and preparing.

Pope Francis wrote: *Advent encourages us to reflect on the contrast between our daily routine and the unexpected coming of the Lord. The Gospel is not trying to frighten us, but to open our horizons, to further dimensions, giving meaning even to everyday occurrences. This perspective is also an invitation to sobriety, to not be dominated by the things of this world, but rather to keep them in their proper place. If, on the other hand, we allow ourselves to be overpowered by a concern for material things, we will not be able to perceive what is much more important: our final encounter with the Lord. And so, Advent is an invitation to vigilance, because, not knowing when He will come, we must always be ready to depart. During Advent we are called to enlarge the horizons of our hearts, to be surprised by the life that is presented each day with its newness. In order to do this we need to learn to not depend on our own securities, our own established plans, because the Lord comes in the hour which we don't imagine.*

Advent takes place during the darkest days of the year when there is the least sunlight. It reminds us that the light of Christ will triumph over all darkness in the world. And God knows there's much darkness out there: war, terrorism, violence, hunger, disease, racism, materialism, and the list goes on. The work for us Christians is to bring all these things to an end. Of course, we have to **begin with ourselves** by surrendering to any darkness within! St. Paul says in the 2nd reading, *May the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all... be blameless before God.*

Each of us can begin **fresh** with a clean slate. **That's Advent!** Then on Christmas morning, we can greet the Christ-Child with joyful hearts. **And** when the Lord comes in his glory and power... he'll find us joyful and ready! May this be a season of hope and grace... and also a time of **transformation** for each of us. Blessings!
