The Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends:

This Saturday, February 10th at the 5:00 PM Mass, we welcome Bishop Bergie to our parish, as 28 young adults celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation. Many thanks to Bishop Bergie, and many blessings to our young adults.

. . . .

Today, February 11th, is *World Day of the Sick*! This was instituted in 1992 by Pope John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes. Pope Francis wrote the



following, "Jesus bestowed upon the Church his healing power. The Church's mission is a response to Jesus' gift, for she knows that she must bring to the sick the Lord's own gaze, full of tenderness and compassion." We each have a role to play in caring for those who are ill. Every Mass at St. Pat's, we remember those who have asked

for our prayers. We pray for all who are hospitalized. We can never underestimate the power of prayer for those who are ill.

In today's Gospel Jesus heals a man with leprosy. In the 1st Reading from *Leviticus*, we hear the rules for the community to protect itself from this disease. Leprosy was believed to be incurable and contagious, and it included many skin disorders. Lepers were ostracized by their families and neighbours, and forced to live on the outskirts of villages. They were referred to as the *Living Dead*, had to wear torn clothes and let their hair go uncombed and uncut. They had to shout, "Unclean" if others came near. Anyone who came into contact with a leper was rendered unclean also.

With this background, we can see why Jesus' actions were so powerful! What did he do? **Moved with pity**, Jesus stretched out his hand, **touched** the leper, and cured him! Jesus rendered himself ritually unclean in the eyes of the onlookers. Jesus didn't care! That's what love does. He looked beyond the law, saw a human soul in misery, and healed him with his loving **touch**. In the 2nd reading, Paul calls us to imitate Christ by being instruments of His healing power.

How do I approach the untouchables and outcasts, and those whom I find difficult to love? Whom do I render unclean? Or judge unfit? Or ostracize? We are to touch and support not just the physically sick, but all those whose lives are hurting and need healing in any way. Feeling pity, and showing mercy and compassion are Christian qualities of **great minds and large hearts**. May we never forget that God is always ready to show **us** his mercy and to free us from whatever makes **us** unwell. Have a healing week!

So, in these days before Lent, we need to prepare our hearts, by realizing how much we want to grow in freedom, how much we need to lighten our spirits and experience some real joy, and how much some parts of our lives really need changing. Have a grace-filled season of Lent!

The Giving Bowl "A Lenten Sacrifice" for St. Pat's!

Once again this Lent, we will have a special container at the front and back of the church. All donations will assist *The Giving Bowl*, which feeds up to 1100 children at local Catholic Schools in Eastern Uganda. This is the only hot meal these children get each day! They also assist with medical issues, uniforms and tuition. Please place your donations into these containers during Lent! This is a Registered Charity under the CRA, and they issue their own receipts for Income Tax Purposes. Approximately 80% of their funds go directly to the Food Program. The other 20% is used for school fees for the most desperate, a school uniform to replace the most tattered, also notebooks and pencils, medical supplies, and in dire cases, to purchase a goat for very needy families. If you use the parish offertory envelopes, you must make the cheque payable to *St. Patrick Parish*. We issue a cheque to *The Giving Bowl* at the end of each month.
