The Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends:

Last Saturday we had a wonderful celebration of Confirmation for our young adults. Bishop Bergie called the candidates (and all of us) to use wisely the Gifts of the Holy Spirit in their lives. They are gifts given to be used. He also highlighted the importance of the family, school and parish working together as one. May God bless our young adults on their faith journey. We keep them in prayer.

. . . .

This is the 1st Sunday in the Season of Lent. Lent is referred to as the *spring-time' of the soul*. In the Gospel we hear that, *After Jesus was baptized, the Spirit drove him out into the wilderness for forty days, tempted by Satan*. Jesus made it through those 40 days, as Angels waited on him.

We are now on this 40-Day journey of Lent, from Ash Wednesday to Holy Thursday (Sundays excluded). Every Sunday is a "Little Easter". Our 40 days commemorates the time Jesus spent in the desert prior to beginning his public ministry in Galilee. It prepares us for the Crucifixion of Jesus and his Resurrection on the Great Solemnity of Easter. So what do we do with this time?

Well, this is a sacred time when we are encouraged to take on the threefold mission of **fasting**, **almsgiving**, **and prayer**. [There is an article on **fasting** in this bulletin.] **Almsgiving** is making the needs of others our own, especially the poor, hungry and homeless in our community and in our world. We have many opportunities in our parish for reaching out to the poor. St. Augustine described fasting and almsgiving as "the two wings of prayer," because they are signs of humility and charity.

Prayer helps us grow in our relationship with God and to deepen our commitment to a way of life, rooted in our baptism. Lent is a great time to read scripture, to be more faithful to Mass, to spend quiet time with God, to meditate, to avail of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, to pray the Stations of the Cross. Prayer also provides us with the necessary opportunity to reflect on our shortcomings and sins. We all need to pray more earnestly, and even experience sorrow for the things we failed to do.

May we allow God to help us grow in this *spring-time'* of the soul!!! We pray for each other along this Lenten journey! Blessings on your Lent!

What is fasting and abstinence?

The penitential days and times in the universal Church are every Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent. Abstinence from eating meat is to be observed on every Friday of the year unless a Friday occurs on a solemnity. Abstinence and fasting are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is the limitation of food and drink – typically to one main meal and two smaller meals, with no solid foods in between. The law of abstinence binds those who are 14 years of age and older. The law of fasting, however, binds all those from age 18-59. Nevertheless, pastors of souls and parents are to take care that minors not bound by the law of fast and abstinence are also educated in a genuine sense of penance. The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops decrees that the days of fast and abstinence in Canada are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fridays are days of abstinence but Catholics may substitute special acts of charity or piety on this day.

The Giving Bowl "A Lenten Sacrifice" for St. Pat's!

Once again this Lent, we will have a special container at the front and back of the church. All donations will assist *The Giving Bowl*, which feeds up to 1100 children at local Catholic Schools in Eastern Uganda. This is the only hot meal these children get each day! They also assist with medical issues, uniforms and tuition. Please place your donations into these containers during Lent! This is a Registered Charity under the CRA, and they issue their own receipts for Income Tax Purposes. Approximately 80% of their funds go directly to the Food Program. The other 20% is used for school fees for the most desperate, a school uniform to replace the most tattered, also notebooks and pencils, medical supplies, and in dire cases, to purchase a goat for very needy families. If you use the parish offertory envelopes, you must make the cheque payable to *St. Patrick Parish*. We issue a cheque to *The Giving Bowl* at the end of each month.

Once again we wish to remind our Envelope users, that if you use the *St. Vincent de Paul* or *The Giving Bowl* Church envelopes, found in your boxes, please make cheques payable to *St. Patrick Parish*. The parish issues a cheque to each organization at the end of every month, and also issues a parish tax receipt. If you wish to make a donation directly to the organization, then please use an envelope other than the Official Church Envelopes. The parish cannot issue a receipt for a cheque made payable to another entity or organization! Thanks for your cooperation!
