

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

This is the last Sunday before the Season of Lent begins! It is hard to believe that Ash Wednesday will be here this week. Time flies. This past week I hosted our first Deanery Meeting at St. Patrick Parish, as Dean. It went very well. Many thanks to Fr. Marc for leading the Prayer Service, and to the dedicated ladies for preparing the luncheon!

Today's Gospel is a continuation of Jesus' *Sermon on the Mount!* And his teachings get more challenging! Jesus tells the crowds.... You have heard that it was said... but I say... *Do not resist an evildoer; turn the other cheek; give your cloak as well; go a second mile; give to all who beg from you; do not refuse anyone who wants to borrow from you! Love your enemies, and pray for your persecutors!*

These are tough teachings. And sadly, many ignore them, and deem them unrealistic! Why? Because they go against the grain! These are Jesus' commands of love. His **New Law of LOVE!** These **LAWS** are to be part of our lives. Living these can separate us from the way of the world! It's called being counter-cultural, going against the grain, a radical love. God does not give us commands that are impossible to obey. He certainly gives us ones that are difficult, and challenging... but never ones that are impossible. They take work. And we must try our best every day, always remembering that life is lived, **one day at a time**.

G.K. Chesterton, once wrote: *Christianity has not been tried and found wanting; it has been found difficult and not tried.* A great week to re-read the Sermon on the Mount... and ask ourselves, where am I falling short? Where am I excelling? Where can I improve? We must continually scrutinize our actions to see if we are living up to the standards set by Jesus. He never said that following him would be easy. He did promise that he would be with us through it all! As we begin Lent, let's give God glory and praise by trying our best to live his radical ways! Many blessings!
