The Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends:

On this 2nd Sunday of Lent our Gospel takes us to the *Mount of Transfiguration*. This is a very high mountain, with a long winding road. Only small vehicles can drive up there. The view is spectacular, although the drive up and down is certainly not for the faint of heart! After five trips up and down that mountain, it never got any easier. I actually closed my eyes a few times. On the top is a spectacular view and beautiful church, with two side chapels, called *Moses Chapel* and *Elijah Chapel*.



Jesus takes Peter, James and John up that mountain. A WOW experience. I think Jesus wanted these three Apostles to have a foretaste of Easter. He wanted to give them hope for the coming weeks. Moses and Elijah appear... and Jesus is Transfigured, changed before them! Became dazzling white! Then we hear a voice from the cloud, "This is my Son, the Beloved, listen to him!" Pope Francis said, "Listen to Jesus and

follow him. That's the message of the Transfiguration!"

How are we doing with our Lenten observances so far? Our promises to ourselves, our promises to God? Is our fasting, abstaining, increase in prayer or almsgiving, going as planned? If not, maybe today, with an Easter experience like this, we can get ourselves back on track. Our Risen Christ is there with us, urging us on, giving us the power and courage to change.

This Gospel can also serve as a call for us to find our own private mountain-top, an *out of the way* place to spend quiet time with Jesus. We can do that by setting aside a few minutes each day to go to our own transfiguration places... to read and meditate on the scriptures. Maybe come to the Stations of the Cross and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Friday nights. Maybe increase our frequency in celebrating the transfiguration of the Eucharist at Holy Mass. Wherever we choose to find silence... and alone-time with God, may we be open to a "Wow" experience! And always remain open to conversion and change! Good things happen when we least expect it.

Once again this Lent, we will have a special container at the front and back of the church. All donations will assist *The Giving Bowl*, which feeds up to 1100 children at local Catholic Schools in Eastern Uganda. This is the only hot meal these children get each day. They also assist with medical issues, uniforms and tuition. Please place your donations into these containers during Lent! This is a Registered Charity under the CRA, and they issue their own receipts for Income Tax Purposes. Approximately 80% of their funds go directly to the Food Program. The other 20% is used for school fees for the most desperate, a school uniform to replace the most tattered, also notebooks and pencils, medical supplies, and in dire cases, to purchase a goat for very needy families. If you use the parish offertory envelopes, you must make the cheque payable to *St. Patrick Parish*. We issue a cheque to *The Giving Bowl* at the end of each month.
