The Pastor's Pen

#### Dear Friends:

February is here! The word, *February* comes from the Latin, *februum-februa*, which means *to purify, to cleanse, to atone*. So I guess we all have our work cut out for us this month! [Remember, Ash Wednesday is on February 14<sup>th</sup> this year, the day we embark upon the Season of Lent!

Next Saturday, February 10<sup>th</sup>, at the 5:00 PM Mass, we will welcome Bishop Bergie to our parish for the celebration of the *Sacrament of Confirmation* for 28 young adults. This is a joyful time for our parish and for the Church. We keep our candidates in prayer. God be with our young adults.

For several Sundays, we have Gospels from Mark about Jesus' healings. Last Sunday, we heard about Jesus driving an evil spirit from a man in the synagogue at Capernaum. One place we always visit on our pilgrimages to the Holy Land is *Capernaum*. It's an amazing city. And more amazing to stand among the remnants of the synagogue. This Sunday we hear, that after Jesus left the synagogue, he went to Peter's mother in law's house. [The remnants of this house are still there. It has been unearthed by archeologists.] She is in bed with a fever. Jesus takes her hand and heals her. Next Sunday, Jesus will heal a man with leprosy.

We all love miracles and healings. One of the most sacred things we do as Christians is **pray for those who are sick**. We bring individual intentions before God every day at St. Patrick's. It is such an important

part of our faith. What struck me most about today's Gospel is that Jesus broke all first century Jewish taboos by taking this woman *by the hand*. Men did not touch women in those days! But Jesus would go on to touch many people. That's our God of love. And also quite

striking, is that when she was healed, she **immediately got up**, and as a way of thanking Jesus, she **began to serve**. Could she not have rested after her illness? She may have been embarrassed and ashamed by not being able to greet her guests and take care of them. Jesus not only restored her health but he also restored her dignity. I have this picture in my mind of a little old lady, being made well, and then happily traipsing around in her housecoat, with rollers in her hair, making coffee and sandwiches for Jesus and the guests!

This Gospel tells me that one of the expectations for those who have been saved, (baptized into Christ) is service to others! A great week to reflect on how we serve others, especially the sick. We can never underestimate what prayer and presence can do for someone who is ill! Or for someone who is in need. Have a selfless-serving week. Blessings, Fr. Gerard

#### World Day of the Sick and Our Lady of Lourdes

Sunday, February 11th is World Day of the Sick. Pope St. John Paul II initiated this day in 1992 to encourage people to pray for those who suffer from illness and for their caregivers. The Holy Father himself had been diagnosed with Parkinson's a year before, and it is considered that his own illness was impetus for his designation of the day. *World Day of the Sick* was first observed on February 11, 1993. This is also the *Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes*, which is another title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in honour of the apparitions that took place in and around Lourdes, France, by a young girl named Bernadette Soubirous in 1858. This feast honours the mystery and beauty of the Immaculate Conception.
