# The Presentation of the Lord

Friday, February 2<sup>nd</sup> is the Feast of The Presentation of the Lord. This comes forty days after Christmas. We also know it as the Purification of the Blessed Virgin, and Candlemas Day! Joseph and Mary did what

was required of them. They presented their first-born male child to God. Simeon took Jesus in his arms and was moved to say, my eyes have seen your salvation! Now we know what salvation looks like. It takes on the face and body of a human being, Jesus. God has come among us in human form to live as we live, experience life with us in all its wonder and sorrow, and lead us to a new appreciation of what it means to be truly human.

Imagine ourselves being in the Temple that day, with Mary, and Joseph and Jesus and Anna... and hearing the words of Simeon, *Master, now* you are dismissing your servant in peace according to your word: for my eyes have seen your salvation. Imagine those words being said about us, that we are part of God's plan for salvation. The power of the Gospel is that it infects each of us with its message about who we are. Everyone who reads it or hears it proclaimed can be part of its redemptive message. Each of us is a big part of God's plan of salvation. Each of us is gifted for it, and called to live it.

# St. Blaise - Blessing of Throats

Saturday, February 3rd is the memorial of St. Blaise. Because we have no Mass on Saturday morning, we will have a Blessing of Throats at the end of the 5:00 PM Mass. St. Blaise was the bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the fourth century. Very little is known about his life. According to various accounts he was a physician before becoming a bishop. His story spread throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages because he was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. Since the eighth century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat.
