We now begin the 5th Week of Lent. I was walking around the gardens on Monday, and saw the first daffodils in bloom! This has certainly been an odd winter. Development and Peace- Share Lent

The Share Lent collection for *Development and Peace* is held on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, March 17, 2024 (Solidarity Sunday). Established by the Catholic bishops of Canada in 1967, Development and Peace – Caritas Canada addresses the root causes of poverty, oppression, and inequality by working with partners in the Global South and by mobilizing Canadians in the common struggle for justice and dignity. The theme of this year's campaign is "Reaping Our Rights". "Everywhere on Earth, and especially in the Global South, impoverished populations are facing growing challenges due to climate change, land grabbing, resource theft, soil contamination and armed conflict. Rural populations are particularly affected by these upheavals, and Development and Peace supports them in defending their rights to life, land, water, biodiversity, justice, health, participation, decent livelihoods, a healthy environment & more."

The Giving Bowl "A Lenten Sacrifice" for St. Pat's!

We have special boxes at the front and back of the church. All donations will assist *The Giving Bowl*, which feeds up to 1100 children at local Catholic Schools in Eastern Uganda. This is the only hot meal these children get each day. They also assist with medical issues, uniforms and tuition. Please place your donations into these containers during Lent! This is a Registered Charity under the CRA, and they issue their own receipts for Income Tax Purposes. Approximately 80% of their funds go directly to the Food Program. The other 20% is used for school fees for the most desperate, a school uniform to replace the most tattered, also notebooks and pencils, medical supplies, and in dire cases, to purchase a goat for very needy families.

If you use the parish offertory envelopes, you must make the cheque payable to *St. Patrick Parish*. We issue a cheque to *The Giving Bowl* at the end of each month.
