The Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends:

On the 1st Sunday of Lent, we went with Jesus into the desert. Last Sunday we went upon a high mountain for the Transfiguration. This Sunday we are with Jesus at the entrance of the Temple. These are places where special encounters with God happen. Sacred places.

Here at the Temple, we see Jesus in an outburst of anger. He turns tables



over and drives the people and animals out. God was being dishonoured. The Temple had become a den of thieves. What provoked Jesus? Was it because of the selling in the Temple? No. It was because of the

exploitation that was involved. Exploitation is stealing, and it is condemned in our first reading today (Ten Commandments).

Remember, this is the Passover, a great Jewish feast. People came from everywhere. They came with different currencies. To pay the compulsory Temple Tax, the people needed to change their money into shekel. That explains the money changers. Jesus did not get angry because of their presence, but because they were **cheating the pilgrims**. They changed their money at a much higher rate, thereby cheating and stealing. The same thing goes for the sheep, cattle and pigeons. These were required for Temple sacrifice. But they were sold to the pilgrims at very high prices. This was stealing in Jesus' eyes.

His house that was supposed to be a house of prayer, had been turned into a den of robbers. People were cheated and misled, especially the poor. Jesus had every right to be angry. Prayer was the purpose of the Temple, not profit. Jesus was angry because instead of being a place of connection with God, this area had become a place of corruption. You may have heard the term *righteous indignation*. It is an anger that is displayed against sin. It is not a sinful anger, but a holy and righteous hatred of sin. That is what Jesus displayed in the Temple.

A great Lenten question for all of us: Would there be anything in my life that would cause Jesus to have a "righteous indignation"? What needs to be driven from my life, so I can connect fully with God? Have a self-reflecting, and contemplating 3rd week of Lent!

St. Ambrose of Milan tells us that to avoid dissensions we should always be on guard, especially with those who drive us to argue with them, with those who vex and irritate us, and who say things likely to excite us to anger. When we find ourselves in company with such quarrelsome people, we should take refuge in silence, and the wisest plan is not to reply to people whose behavior is so preposterous.

The Giving Bowl "A Lenten Sacrifice" for St. Pat's!

We have special boxes at the front and back of the church. All donations will assist *The Giving Bowl*, which feeds up to 1100 children at local Catholic Schools in Eastern Uganda. This is the only hot meal these children get each day. They also assist with medical issues, uniforms and tuition. Please place your donations into these containers during Lent! This is a Registered Charity under the CRA, and they issue their own receipts for Income Tax Purposes. Approximately 80% of their funds go directly to the Food Program. The other 20% is used for school fees for the most desperate, a school uniform to replace the most tattered, also notebooks and pencils, medical supplies, and in dire cases, to purchase a goat for very needy families. If you use the parish offertory envelopes, you must make the cheque payable to *St. Patrick Parish*. We issue a cheque to *The Giving Bowl* at the end of each month.
