



## The Pastor's Pen

#### Dear Friends:

We have begun the Third Week in the Season of Lent! In today's Gospel, Jesus came into the Temple area and overturned the tables of the buyers and sellers. Why was he so upset? I'm sure all of us have

owned something we consider very sacred, something we would not wish to be defiled by misuse.

Whatever this precious object may be, it could not be as precious to us as the "Temple" was to

Jesus! The merchants and money changers were in the Temple area to perform a legitimate service at Passover time. People were coming to celebrate the historic revelation that God brought them out of Egypt. Pilgrims traveled great distances for the feast. Instead of bringing an animal with them, they could purchase one at the Temple. Money changers were needed because pilgrims had to exchange their foreign coins, [they had images on them, thus forbidden in the Temple.] So, what was the issue?

In earlier times, this buying and selling took place further away, near the Mount of Olives. Jesus clearly encounters *creeping commercialism*. *Animal sacrifices* were a part of the feast but the secular was edging its way into the sacred. God's mercy was being merchandised! Jesus' anger suggests that the merchants were cheating their customers, the devout who came to worship, and also the poor. Jesus revealed the righteous anger that God feels when what is good, gets infiltrated by human greed. While mercy is always available to those who seek it, we cannot forget Jesus' indignation when he encounters injustice and any restrictions on those seeking God. Jesus also wanted to show the people that HE is the New Temple! "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up!" He refers to the temple of his body, and his Resurrection.

What about us? Jesus cleansed the Temple because sinful activities interfered with worship. Do I need to cleanse my heart of attitudes or actions that are coming between me and God? What area of my life would Jesus have to use a "whip of cords?" What is "un-sacred" in my life? What am I doing that is offensive to God? Or what am I not doing, any sins of omission? If we reflect deeply, we can see that Jesus' cleansing of the temple is also a prophetic sign of what he wants to do with each of us. He seeks to cleanse us and make us living temples of his Holy Spirit. If we still have work to do, which I'm sure all of us do, then Lent is a great time for that spiritual house cleaning!
