FROM THE PASTOR

Today is the *Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord*. (Although Thursday was the 40th Day of Easter, Ascension is celebrated in Canada on the 7th Sunday of Easter). Next Sunday is Pentecost.




In today's Gospel, the eleven disciples were directed to a mountain in Galilee to meet Jesus (now the Risen Christ). They must have known there would be a great experience awaiting them. All throughout Scripture, wonderful things happened on mountains! Sure enough, they met the Risen Christ on this Galilean Mountain, and they worshiped him.

Yet, some doubted!

Before he disappeared from their sight, and ascended to the Father, Jesus told them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember I am with you always to the end of the age." These first disciples were sent out to transform the world through the power they received from Jesus, who assured them they would never be left on their own.

We received the same call, commission, at our Baptism. Jesus wants us to finish what he began. He came among us in the flesh, chose disciples, taught them, and worked with them. Died on the cross and rose from the dead. But, before he ascended into heaven, he gave them, and us, the commission to convert the world. He never asked us to do the impossible. To honour Christ, by obeying His call to make disciples of all nations, is something we can do. We simply do it where we are, with those we meet, with those whom we work, with those whom we go to school. Be a witness for Jesus every day in our lives and when necessary, talk about Jesus! Preach to others through our actions! St. Francis said, *"Preach the Gospel always. Sometimes you may have to use words!"* Maybe this week, we can each do one concrete thing, to preach the Good News! If we each do 'one' thing, we can certainly transform our families and neighbourhoods and city! Have a blessed week.
