Dear Friends,

FROM THE PASTOR

Today's Gospel is powerful, and very familiar to us. Filled with so much divine food and comfort. Three lines in this Gospel jump out at me.

How often I have proclaimed the first part of this Gospel at funerals. "If I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself." These words of Jesus give comfort and hope to families at the time of a death. It leaves mourners with the assurance that there is a place prepared for us, when we die. Jesus speaks these words to his disciples shortly before his own death. It was to prepare them for what was about to happen. It gave them hope because he promised he would come back again and take them to himself. That same promise is made to me and you. All the more reason to be faithful to him. Keep the faith alive and active! Keep the message of Christ alive!!! I can't imagine facing death without faith.

Jesus also says, "I am the way, the truth and the life." Maybe we can reflect on how we are following the "way, the truth and the life." If we are faithful to him in life, he promises to be faithful to us in death! God has plenty of time for me and you... but what sort of time do we leave for God? For personal prayer? Community worship? Acts of charity like in our 1st Reading today? Good deeds? When I run into families whom I haven't seen at Church in a while, I always ask how they're doing, or I let them know that I have missed seeing them. I often get the all too familiar responses, "I've been so busy!"; "My Sundays are filled with so many activities!"; "It's the only day I have to sleep in!"; "My kids have hockey, soccer, baseball, ... and many other activities!" Lame excuses to say the least! Granted, there are many who have no choice but to work on Sundays. Maybe we can encourage others, especially our younger family members to give God 45-50 minutes a week for community worship, for our Catholic Sunday Obligation.

Today's Gospel begins with Jesus' words, **"Do not let your hearts be troubled.**" A great week to bring our troubled hearts, our grieving hearts, our restless hearts, our lackadaisical hearts to God for comfort, healing and encouragement. May we feel His Divine Presence this week! Blessings!
